The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, who comes short again and again, because there is no effort without error and shortcoming; but who does actually strive to do the deeds; who knows great enthusiasms, the great devotions; who spends himself in a worthy cause; who at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who neither know victory nor defeat.”

Increase State School Aid

The Superintendent and I wrote a letter to the Governor respectfully requesting a \$2 million increase in the 2017-18 NJ State School Aid for the Bound Brook School District. We noted that the existing school aid formula is flawed and there is no immediate remedy forthcoming. Currently, Bound Brook property taxes support approximately \$14 million of the Board of Education budget and we need this exception to the aid formula to maintain a reasonable level of property taxes in Bound Brook.

This has been an effort supported by many Bound Brook residents, but if you agree with this effort, **write to the Governor expressing your support.**

In the early days they raised field flowers and tended to their greenhouses on Greenbrook Road in Middlesex. From there they went on to have a successful wholesale business. Joined by their four children Tracy, Jay, Gretta and Erika their flower shop 11Petaldeddlers" opened on Hamilton Street in 1972. Twenty plus years later the business outgrew its location. Cal purchased the former Bound Brook Inn and moved the operation now called "America's Florist" to the big white house on West Union Avenue. Calvin and Jane retired to Florida in 2010. His children and their spouses continue to run the business today.

In addition to his wife and children, Cal is survived by eight grandchildren, five great-grandchildren with a sixth expected in January. 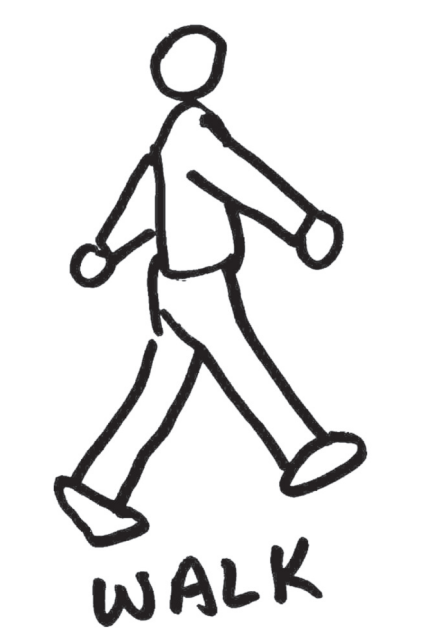
Merry Christmas Bound Brook

Literacy Volunteers Partners With Local Libraries in 2017 to Continue Positive Impact on Community

Hundreds Benefit From Organizations Services; Additional Programs Offered at SCLSNJ Libraries

Earlier this year, Literacy Volunteers of Somerset County reported that, in one year, more than 350 students received LVSC free services: 236 adults received weekly tutoring from 184 volunteer tutors; more than 100 students participated in Conversation Groups; and 20 students completed U.S. Citizenship Preparation Classes. In all, volunteers provided more than 8,000 hours of free literacy instruction. And that's just the beginning.

"There are many adults in our community who are eager to improve their English literacy and become an integrated part of the community," said Aimee Lam, LVSC executive director. "Each has a different reason to seek literacy instruction: some want financial independence but need better literacy skills on the job, others want to read to their child or grandchild, and the vast majority want to be able to communicate confidently. We are proud to help these hard working individuals and are grateful to our volunteers who commit the time and energy to provide literacy instruction. To meet the local need, LVSC plans to train a greater number of volunteer tutors in 2017 while increasing Conversation Group and U.S. Citizenship Preparation class of-

ferings in county libraries."

LVSC has announced that the organization will once again partner with Somerset County Library System of New Jersey to provide services to the community. Services will include English Conversation Groups, Become a Literacy Tutor information sessions, and a U.S. Citizenship Preparation Class.

"The English conversation groups and citizenship classes led by LVSC and hosted by our libraries are helping new Americans integrate into our communities," said Marcela Dunham, SCLSNJ system programming coordinator. "By giving these adult learners the gift of language, they are now better able to communicate with their children's teachers, as well as successfully navigate doctors' visits and job interviews. By partnering with LVSC, we're welcoming new Americans into our libraries, opening a new world of knowledge and opportunity to experience everything the libraries have to offer to them, while creating positive experiences and lasting bonds with tutors, fellow students, and the community in general. We look forward to collaborating with LVSC in 2017 to develop new classes and
